Adventure at Sandy Cove.
As part of adventure recounts, the writer builds up suspense by using a variety of techniques. One way a writer can do this is by showing a person's reactions, 'telling us how they are feeling'. Task 1: Use the template in the resource pack to write one or two ways of how 'show not tell' the various emotions (see below). You can use the 'show not tell' the resource pack to help you.

For example:	Telling	Showing

The work can be done on paper, on the computer or in an exercise book. We recommend that your child completes the work in the order presented, as this is similar to a normal school day. However, we recognise that circumstances are different for each family and you may find it more convenient to manage the activities in another way.

Submitting work online to the class teacher

The daily learning plan will identify one piece of work that should be submitted to the teacher using j2write, in order for them to mark it. j2write is the same system used for submitting weekly homework. (Instructions are on the other side of this paper). Photographs taken of completed work can be submitted using j2write if preferred.

If you need to look back at a previous week's home learning, click the relevant buttons on the same webpage.

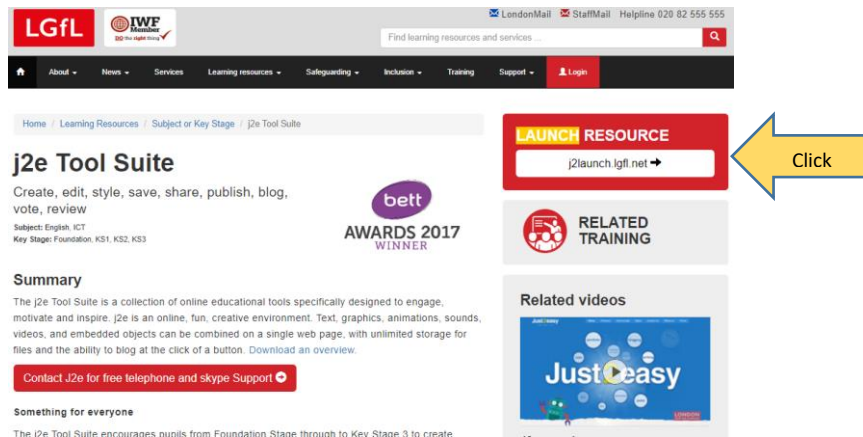

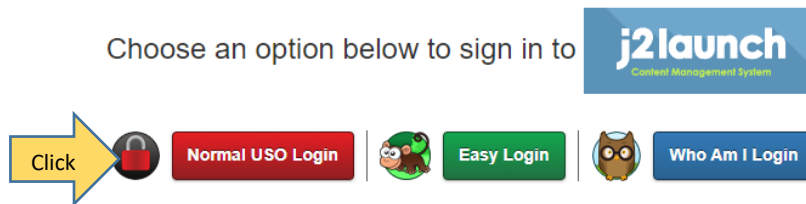

Accessing j2 Launch and j2write to submit work

1. Go to: <https://www.lgfl.net/learning-resources/summary-page/j2e-tool-suite>



2. Click on Launch resource.



If in doubt, click "Normal USO Login".

3. Click on Normal USO login

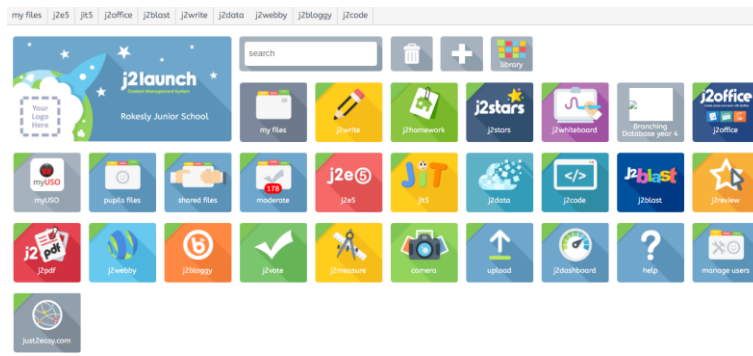
Please enter your **USO** username and password, then click the Login button.

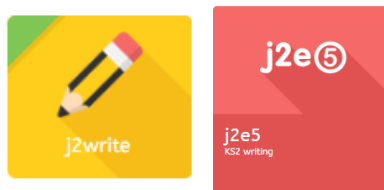

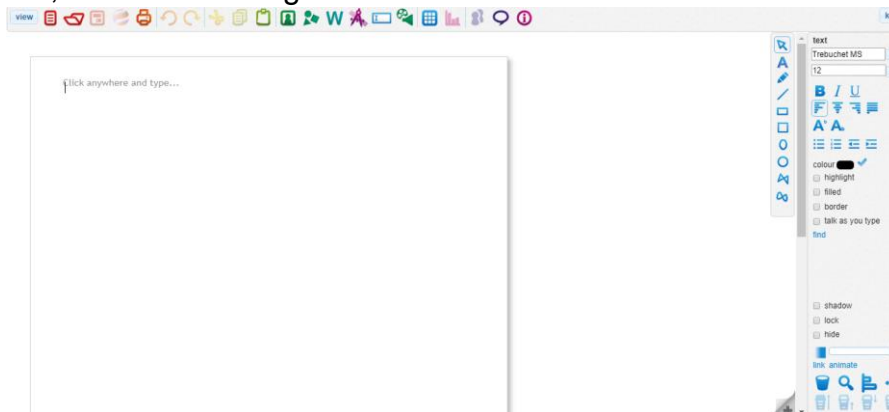
4. Enter your child's Lgfl account and password, then log in. (If you cannot find this information and your child does not remember them, contact the school).
