Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back to the last half term of this academic year. As always it will be a busy one as we plan for the academic year ahead. As the half term progresses, I will keep you up to date with relevant information.

Year 6 Return to school

Year 6 will be returning to school from Monday 8th June.

Thank you to all of you that completed the survey as this has helped us with our planning for their return.

On their return they will be split into smaller group sizes so as to maintain social distancing. I will be writing to year 6 parents separately later on today with more specific details.

As we begin to return to school our main priority is the health and safety of the children, staff and the wider school community.

We have carried out and developed a comprehensive risk assessment that will continue to evolve over time. The risk assessment is currently being reviewed by the local authority. It will also be reviewed by the main teaching and support staff unions before being reviewed and adopted by our governing body at a meeting being held on Thursday.

Years 3, 4 and 5

Unfortunately, I still do not have any additional information on the wider opening of the school to the other year groups. I will let you know as soon as I do.

We shall continue to provide home learning packs for pupils in years 3, 4 and 5 and their teachers will continue to phone them every two weeks. Please bear in mind that from 8th June all teachers will be teaching year 6 in the mornings.

In order to avoid congestion, in the school foyer and at the front of the school, from the 8th June home learning packs can only be collected from school between 10am and 11.30am and then between 1pm and 2.30pm. They will continue to be available on the school website.

Key Worker Provision

This shall continue on a daily basis between 9am and 3pm. The children in this group need to arrive and leave through the main entrance as they have been doing so far.

Year 3 Mix

Due to the unusual times that we are in, we have decided not to mix year 3 pupils at the end of this academic year. We feel that after so long apart to start the new academic year with a new group of children could be an additional cause for anxiety. We shall however be mixing them for year 5.

Thank you for your understanding, cooperation, patience and support at what continues to be a turbulent time for us all.
