Only post photos or videos of people if you have asked their permission first.



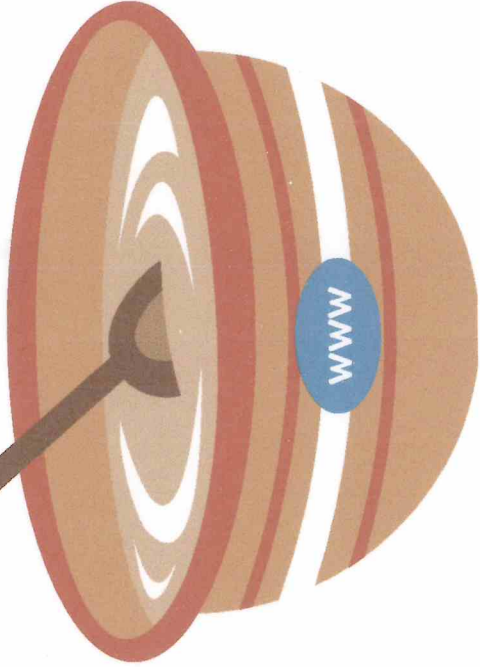
Keep personal information private; this includes your last name, passwords, photos and school name.

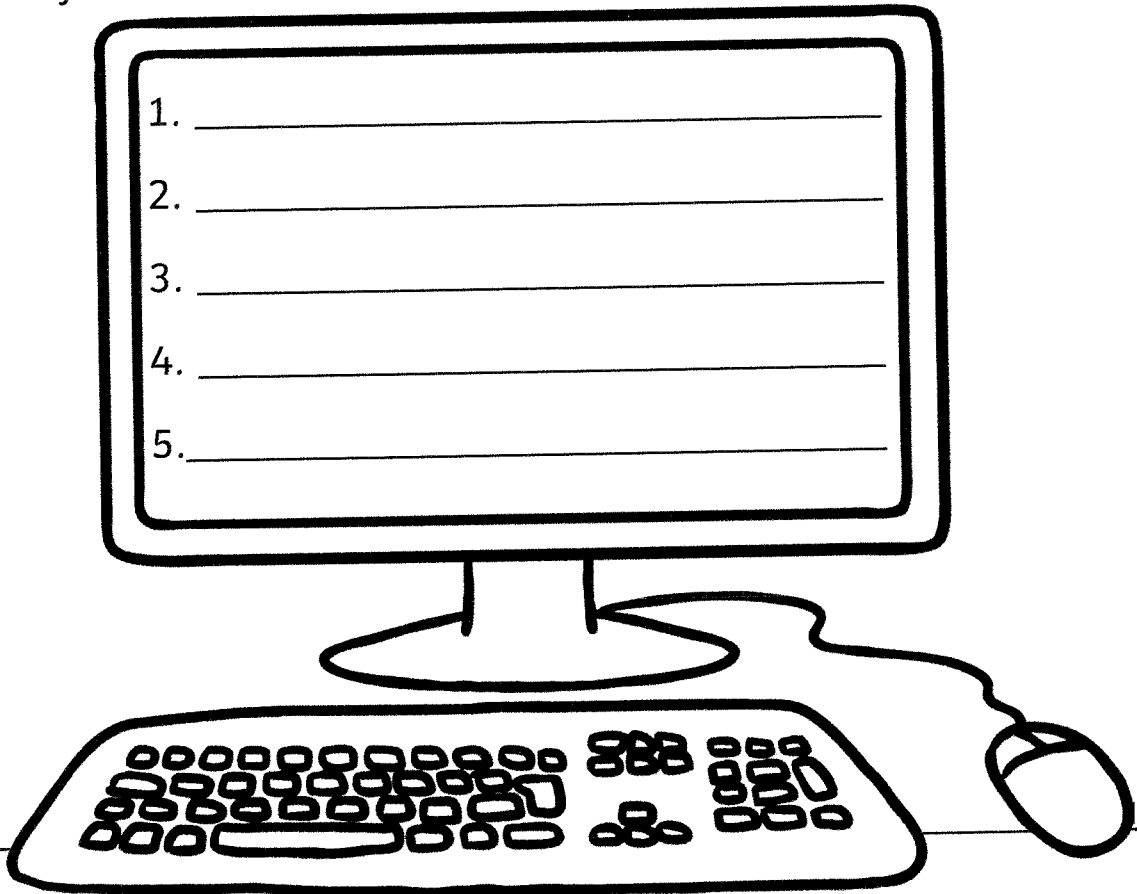
## Amazing Fact
