<b>Maths – Times Table Rock Stars</b>	<p>Make sure you are practising your tables throughout the week so that you can recall them rapidly up to 12 x 12. Remember to improve your score on TTRS.</p> 						
<b>Maths - Mathletics</b>	<p>Login to Mathletics and complete the assigned tasks. If you have more time, you may explore the site further. Remember you can access the resources which include workbooks, so you can practise any areas you need to do a bit more work on.</p> 						
<b>Spellings</b>	<p>This week we have been exploring words ending with ‘-ent’, ‘-ence’ and ‘-ency’. To remind you of the lesson we did in class, we have written the generalisations for knowing when a word ends with the endings above.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• If the root verb ends in ‘-ere’, for example interfere, then it takes ‘-ence’.</li> <li>• If the root verb has a stressed ‘-er’ ending, then it takes ‘-ence’, for example, infer.</li> <li>• If the word contains the syllables ‘cid’, ‘fid’, ‘sid’ or ‘vid’ immediately before the ending, the correct suffix is ‘-ence’, for example, confidence.</li> <li>• If the stem of the word ends in a soft ‘c’ (pronounced like ‘c’ in cell) or a soft ‘g’ (pronounced like ‘g’ in gel), then the ending will be ‘-ence’, for example, innocence.</li> </ul> <p>The words below and the spelling conventions need to be learned for a spelling test in school. <b>Readiwrite Spelling</b>	<p>We would like you to continue to use Readiwrite Spelling during half term. To login, visit the website (<a href="https://login.readiwriter.com/">https://login.readiwriter.com/</a>) and enter your Mathletics login details. We have set it up with word lists which follow rules we have been learning in school. Try to login in a few times a week to improve your spelling.</p>  <p>Start by selecting a spelling rule on the left-hand side and then work your way around the tiles. Begin by reminding yourself of the learning statement by clicking on the motivate tile. Afterwards, you can master the spellings and then deepen your learning in the magnify section.</p>
